What is *Boundless* Fundraising and How Does It Work?

Boundless Fundraising[™] is a Facebook application that enables you, the participant, to link your Participant Center to your Facebook profile. Once you register for the ride, you'll be given the option to add the boundless Fundraising[™] application to your Facebook page with a few simple clicks. Of course, you must have a Facebook profile first, if you don't have one, register now, create your Facebook profile and add boundless Fundraising[™] later. Just look for the icon on your Participant Page.

Once the application has been applied to your Facebook profile, your fundraising progress will be will be displayed on your profile where friends can check your progress and donate to you! Your registration, donations and a countdown to the event will also show in your newsfeeds. Friends can click a link to make a donation towards your participation in the Great New Jersey Country Bike Ride. It's that easy! Participants who have used *boundless* FundraisingTM have increased their fundraising by 73% over those who don't use it. It's no wonder where the application got its name!!

PROMISE TO PAY

Each ride option has its own fundraising minimum that must be met. If you do not meet your fundraising minimum by the ride date, you will be asked to complete a Promise to Pay form. The form will ask for your credit card information and if by the fundraising minimum deadline you have not met the required amount, we will charge your card the full amount or balance due.

Bike MS is a fundraising event that helps to support our local programs and services we offer to over 10,000 people living with MS and their families. Money raised from this event is critical to the overall success of our Chapter. We appreciate your commitment and support!

MEET OUR 2010 BIKE MS AMBASSADOR, KRISTA COLLOPY



Twenty-one years ago, Roe and Tom Collopy participated in their first Bike MS with the Greater North Jersey Chapter (now the New Jersey Metro Chapter) of the National MS Society They had no knowledge of what multiple sclerosis was when they signed up - they just knew that they loved to ride. A few months after participating in this event, the married couple gave birth to their daughter, Krista. The small family lived in a quaint suburban town in northern New Jersey, and basically lived the life of the average American family, until something changed their world forever. Roe and Tom were strolling through a local mall, returning gifts after just celebrating their first Christmas with their daughter. Suddenly, the entire left side of Roe's body went numb. Sensing something was wrong, she went to a doctor who diagnosed her with multiple sclerosis. Although this was a major blow for the Collopys, the disease did not tear the family apart, but rather, served as a catalyst for bringing them closer together.

For Roe, Tom, and Krista, The Great New Jersey Country Bike Ride became a family event. Tom continued to ride every year after his wife was diagnosed, and Roe and Krista would gather up their gear and travel from rest stop to rest stop cheering on every rider that would pass by. Tom, who had a great sense of humor, always brought fun to ride by strapping a stuffed animal to the top of his helmet. Each year, he picked a different character to ride with, including a daisy, a turtle and an octopus just to name a few. When Krista turned five years old, Tom attached a burley to the back of his bike and let his daughter cycle a couple of miles each day during the Ride. Afterwards, Krista would once again join her mom and cheer on the other cyclists. When Krista turned seven, Tom attached an allycat to the back of his bike, which let the two of them ride together for Roe. The Collopy's continued this tradition for the next couple of years, until the family was dealt another major blow. Tom began to see double. He saw doctor after doctor and was finally diagnosed with a malignant brain tumor. The Collopy's were very open with Krista about her mom's MS and they were the same way when Tom got sick. Although he had his own illness to deal with, Tom always kept his wife and daughter as the top priorities in his life. Unfortunately, he lost his battle with cancer less than a year after he was diagnosed.

Losing her father at such a young age was extremely difficult for Krista, but she wanted to keep the tradition of riding in Bike MS for her mom alive...although she knew she couldn't do it alone. Realizing she needed help, Krista decided to create her own team called "Krista's Crew". The team was made up of family and friends who supported Krista and the cause 100%. At his last Bike MS Ride, Tom Collopy and Krista wore stuffed animals of "Tommy" and "Angelica" from the cartoon show "The Rugrats" on their helmets. Every Ride since then, Krista wears "Angelica" on her helmet in memory of her dad. In this way, Tom is still riding with her every year.

When Krista rode her first solo Bike MS at the age of 9, her mom was a little skeptical that she would be able to finish the route. When Krista passed the first rest stop, Roe admittedly thought that her daughter would give up by the time she reached the lunch stop. However, Krista kept on peddling until she finished the entire Ride. Roe had tears running down her face as she saw her daughter cross the finish line and become the youngest team captain in our Chapter's history, and the youngest person to complete the Great New Jersey Country Bike Ride. By accomplishing these feats, Krista sent a clear message to her mom that she would never give up on her.

This year will mark Krista Collopy's 10th anniversary as a participant in Bike MS. "I have learned that MS is like flipping a coin you never know what you are going to get or how you are going to feel. However the Bike Ride allows me to take on MS head to head. A hundred miles on a bike is nothing in comparison to a lifetime with multiple sclerosis", says Krista, "During the ride, when I feel that I can't go on or the hill is just too big, I immediately think of my mom and the struggle she endures everyday. That gives me the drive to dig down deep inside and make it to the finish line." Through the years Krista and her team "Krista's Crew" have raised over \$30,000 in the fight against multiple sclerosis. She has had many fun experiences and some struggles along the way, but through it all she remembers why she participates in this event every year. Krista's mom has had MS for 19 years. This is why she rides.

FUNDRAISING TIPS

- 1. Ask your HR Department if your company has a matching gift program. If it does, be sure to get a matching form and submit it along with your donations. This is an easy way to double your total. Also, encourage your sponsors to ask their companies for matching gift forms. Many sponsors are not aware that this is an option.
- 2. For company teams, have the top fundraiser "win" a lunch with the company president.
- 3. Ask your favorite restaurant or bar to donate a percentage of one evening's income to your team, possibly in return for sponsor privileges.
- 4. Update your personal page to receive online donations.
- 5. Send letters! Riders who send out a personalized letter asking for a donation raise on average ten times more than riders who do not.

The New Jersey Metro Chapter is offering an exciting opportunity for avid Bike MS participants to take part in a cycling challenge! The Bike MS Cycling Series offers 3 wonderful rides and you can take part in all of them.

Select your Primary Ride, commit to raising \$2,000 for that event and participate in the other two rides offered by the New Jersey Metro Chapter for only the price of registration! Use the Passport Program Registration form to register. Transportation, hotels and additional expenses are not covered. The registration fee for each ride differs and all have fee tiers.

Select from the three Bike MS Rides that the NJ Metro Chapter offers:

The "Coast the Coast" Ride starts at Monmouth University in Monmouth County and travels down the beautiful Jersey Shore. There are several route options to select from including the one day 85, 50 and 25 mile routes or the two day 170-mile ride. The two day adventure finishes in historic Cape May.

The "Hops to Hops" Ride in mid-September commences and concludes in the quaint town of Lambertville. This lovely one day ride travels 40 miles through the gorgeous hills of the Amwell Valley.

The Safety Zone is the National MS Society's latest safety initiative to provide participants with a safe, enjoyable cycling adventure. You put passion into training for the ride and raising awareness for MS. Now, make it your mission to be a safe and courteous rider.

Safety isn't just about wearing your cycling helmet and knowing the rules of the road. Those are very important measures, but cycling safety also involves a wide variety of topics such as hydration, bike maintenance, cycling etiquette, group riding skills and much more!

Safety and courtesy are personal responsibilities. As the rides grow in size each year, the integrity is at risk with the townships we ride through due to size and collective behavior.

We are all ambassadors for cycling as we travel along the roadways and through the many communities along the way. Be especially considerate of our friends and neighbors who are gracious enough to share our route with us. We are guests in each community we ride through. Among other things, this means that cyclists need to share the road as local traffic travels to and from their homes.

Bike MS strongly encourages you to review the compiled Bike Safety information. This information will help you prepare and guide you during the ride. We appreciate your commitment to creating a safer Bike MS ride.

Your behavior matters. Each cyclist makes a difference to the ride. Together we all make a difference to those with MS.
